

# What Future for The Unicorn?

Last month's Crier was particularly helpful in giving residents of Cublington a greater knowledge and understanding of the situation concerning the Unicorn. I thought the article detailing the activities of the Friends of the Unicorn was extremely helpful and summarised very effectively the work that they and all their supporters have done and which led to the recent offer of £357,500 for the freehold of the pub. This offer was at a premium of 10% to the independent valuation which the Friends group had commissioned recently. The note included in the Crier by Chris George, indicated that the offer 'fell far short' of his 'village discounted price' and hinted at future developments which might include the reopening the pub 'at some point in the future'.



The Unicorn is a special pub and, until last September, held for many generations of residents, an important place in the social infrastructure of the village. It was arguably the 'best pub in the area' and was the place where residents of all ages, backgrounds etc. freely met in a friendly and very sociable environment. In a wide variety of ways its closure is damaging to every resident of Cublington and with the village facing other significant challenges, including the alarming increase in numbers and noise from cars travelling through its centre, it is a very unwelcome unresolved issue.

The specialness of the Unicorn as a pub and village amenity, may well support a view that it is worth a premium to a traditional independent valuation. However, it is difficult to appreciate how such a premium could be substantial enough to bridge the gap between the fully equipped and trading independent valuation of £445,000 and the owners current asking price of £650,000 (reduced from £675,00 when it was initially marketed nearly a year ago) or indeed, the reported 'village discounted sale price' of around £625,000.

In the current climate, the Friends of the Unicorn have done an outstanding job in raising pledges of nearly £430,000, almost exclusively from local residents. However, even with the benefit of widespread publicity, including our MP raising it in a question in Parliament, it is difficult to foresee significant further funding being secured, particularly if the asking price remains materially above the highest independent valuation.

Personally, I have always believed that the best interests of Cublington residents would be served by the Unicorn being owned and operated by the same individual(s), preferably living in, or close to, the village. This view has only been reinforced by events during and post covid, which have made it substantially more difficult for the hospitality sector in general and rural pubs in particular. That said, there remain striking examples, some locally, where well managed and effectively operated village pubs can make a commercial return for their owners. It is to be hoped that, in the not-too-distant future, whoever owns the Unicorn can re-establish our pub in this situation.

As I said at the start of this note, I thought the article in last month's Crier and the insert from Chris George provided Cublington residents with useful information about the current position of the Unicorn. However, in the absence of any evident route forward for the village, or anyone else, to acquire the freehold and consequently our pub remaining closed, I hope that it might prelude a period of closer communication and understanding between the interested parties with a view to resolving what is a very sad and unsatisfactory situation. The Unicorn has hitherto been an exceedingly valuable asset to the village and has operated on a sustainable basis for its owners.

It is my hope that future issues of The Crier might usefully provide a forum for both the current owners and residents to express their views on the importance to the community of re-opening The Unicorn.



# HARRY POTTER FANS...



Wightwick Hall steaming at Quainton Road this October to show off her new red livery!

Sunday 5th & Sunday 19th October

You may have heard recently when we announced that our steam loco Wightwick Hall BR (WR) 4-6-0 5MT no.6989 will play the role of the iconic locomotive for the Hogwarts Express in the highly anticipated Harry Potter television series! Wightwick Hall was rescued from the scrapyard by our volunteers over 40 years ago and beautifully restored; and now she shall play the role of one of the most famous steam trains in the world!

Wightwick Hall has completed her first filming session and will be returning home to Quainton Road (aka Buckinghamshire Railway Centre) for a short time in October. Visitors to the railway centre on two special Steaming Days - Sunday 5th and Sunday 19thOctober - will be treated to passenger rides in carriages pulled by the film star herself in her shiny new red livery.

Wightwick Hall will return to the film set in 2026. She remains on long-term loan to the Bluebell Railway in West Sussex, where she will usually be based in between filming over the next eight years. This is the first time the public will see her in her new red coat of paint!

Visitors to Buckinghamshire Railway Centre in Quainton will be able to see other locomotives and carriages going through similar restoration processes in their bid to keep the age of steam alive for future generations. They have a 40-acre site amidst the Buckinghamshire countryside, based around a disused railway station, Quainton Road, that was formerly on the Metropolitan railway line. The site has a large railway museum, working steam engines offering passenger rides and many railway exhibits and memorabilia of the bygone days of steam. Taking pride of place at the site is their stunning glass-roofed visitor centre. This beautiful building is the disused Oxford city centre railway station building, which was dismantled and re-built at Quainton Road in 2002.

# Six red flags for sepsis you should never ignore

Cases of the potentially fatal blood infection sepsis are increasingly on the rise. We look at its causes, symptoms and how it is treated



This is another sign of septic shock, in which the body's immune system goes into overdrive, reducing the blood supply to the skin and vital organs.

An easy way to remember the six signs is that the above list spells out 'SEPSIS'.

Sign and symptoms of sepsis



### 1. Slurred speech or confusion

Difficulty speaking means that the muscles you rely on for speech have been weakened. This is a sign that a blood-borne infection may have reached the brain, causing damage.

# 2. Extreme shivering or muscle pain

Extreme shivering is a sign of worsening sepsis which is progressing beyond an ordinary fever. The skeletal muscle system can become compromised as a result of sepsis, causing pain.

### 3. Passing no urine in a day

Because the body is in a state of shock because of the widespread inflammation caused by sepsis, patients pass little to no urine, even after a day.

#### 4. Severe breathlessness

Sepsis impacts organs throughout the body, and this is an indication that the person's lungs have become compromised and they may need a replacement ventilator.

#### 5. It feels like you're going to die

Studies examining warning signs of sepsis have reported patients becoming anxious and describing a fear that their life is in danger.

#### 6. Skin is mottled or discoloured

This is another sign of septic shock, in which the body's immune system goes into overdrive, reducing the blood supply to the skin and vital organs.

An easy way to remember the six signs is that the above list spells out 'SEPSIS'.

# SLOE Gin RECIPE - this is so simple!

500g ripe sloes (Right now they're perfect!)

250g golden caster sugar

1 litre gin

#### Step 1


Rinse and pick over the sloes, then pat dry in a clean tea towel. *Either* Using a stainless steel fork or cocktail stick, prick the sloes and tip into a 2-litre glass jar, or divide between two smaller jars. *Alternatively* freeze on a tray after washing, this negates the need to prick each berry. Then place in hars as above.



Add the sugar and gin, then seal the jar. Shake well. Once a day for seven days, give the jar a good shake. Store the jar in a cool, dark place and leave for two to three months.

### Step 3

Line a plastic sieve with a square of muslin set over a bowl and strain the sloe gin through it. Decant into clean, dry bottles, then seal and label. The sloe gin is now ready to drink but it'll improve and mature over time – so, if possible, make it one year to drink the next.

# From the new Team Vicar

### Hello from Rev'd Will, the new Team Vicar

Hello! My name is Will. I'm the new Team Vicar of the Cottesloe Benefice. I'm really excited to be starting the next chapter of my life here working alongside Dom who will continue as our Team Rector.





I originally come from North Yorkshire, where I grew up and attended school before studying Theology at Cambridge University and King's College London. During this time, I did some work experience as a sports photojournalist for a few local and student-produced newspapers. I also have roots in Brighton and Hove, where I lived for a few years and found my love of football; I am a keen supporter of Brighton & Hove Albion football club!

I have always been a Christian, and was Baptised at my local Church where I sang in the choir. At my Confirmation, I can remember the Bishop asking me to "Pray very hard, as I will be for you"... that's the first time I remember praying with such concentration.

But my faith became much deeper and developed during my teenage years. My parents both died very young; by the time I was thirteen years old, I had been orphaned. ## LATEST UPDATES

### North Field Update

September has seen more general maintenance tasks around North Field and Orchard Ground with our volunteers removing a dozen or so self seeded ash trees that were starting to shade the allotments, trimming overhanging branches on the main driveway to the pavilion, a checking tree stakes and deer netting after the heavy rain and stormy winds. We are very grateful to Hugh for cutting the boundary hedges to North Field and for trimming the marking area. Many thanks too for the Parish Council repositioning the new dog poo bin to just inside the gate by Stewkley Road. Despite clear instructions, the Bucks Council contractors had placed it at an odd angle on Stewkley Road.

As the autumn approaches, we have some 50 small trees around 1.0m - 1.5m tall in the nursery area which can soon be planted out into the main field. We're in contact with the Tree Council about grant funding for several tree saplings of Black Poplar trees. As highlighted in a previous edition of the Crier, we have one very old Black Poplar tree in our boundary hedge near to the bench that David and Freddie donated to North Field.

We're in discussions with another grant funder about a storage container and a rough cut mower for North Field.

# **Update for pledgers!**

We continue to strive in our endeavours to purchase The Unicorn, to restore and to open again as a successful operation.

We recognise the work/investment made by the George Family over the last two decades, and by their Partners and teams. We have considered the proposals made by Chris George last month but we do not see that they are viable at this time. We will continue to negotiate around the Red Book valuation, but not the inflated current asking price. The 'discounted price' to the village was set at £625,000, still a long way off the value

(£325,000) reached by an independent certified valuation.

Owning a pub premises is not the same as owning any property in a village. It comes with a caveat - and a responsibility - it is a pub and not a house - and as such should be run as a pub for the benefit of the community it serves. (Albeit commercially viable). Many in this village, chose Cublington for its impressive community spirit, of which the pub and the Church are arguably the kingpins.



We are fighting not just for our village but for the wider area - several local villages have already lost their own pubs. Although we have sufficient funds pledged to buy the pub - at a fair and reasonable price - we need to raise additional funds to cover professional fees, stamp duty and so on. It is also part of our business plan to improve the living accommodation to attract the right tenants to make a proper home in our community, for the long term.

Email from Laura Kyrke-Smith's office to Cublington Parish Council Dear All,

I wanted to provide you an update on the actions that came out of Laura's recent visit to the Chatty Café in Cublington and to thank you for hosting us.

On the issue of Thames Water, as Laura's caseworker I have raised this directly with Thames Water and they have requested direct contact to discuss the issues. I have spoken to Mike Joy and provided contact details for him to speak to Thames Water directly on his return from holiday.

Regarding the closures and staff shortages at 3W Health (Wing Surgery), we have written directly to the Surgery and Laura is visiting them to discuss these concerns in August – we will provide a further update after this meeting.

In terms of the concerns of the issues raised around speeding and enforcement again I have written on Laura's behave to both Buckinghamshire Council and Thames Valley Police and I am currently awaiting a response on these. Again, as soon as we receive a response we will provide you with an update.

## Email from Thames Valley Police to Laura Kyrke-Smith's office Dear Debbie

We do not currently have any mobile or fixed camera enforcement sites in Cublington. Looking at reported injury collisions for the latest 5 years (01/02/2020 to 31/01/2025) there have been 2 slight injury collisions one in 2020 and one in 2021. Neither had speeding as a reported possible causation factor.

There is an active speedwatch group in Cublington and they are regularly carrying our speedwatch education sessions. Community Speedwatch can be a very effective tool to help tackle local speeding issues and it can often be the action needed to educate drivers and reduce speeding. In addition the data gathered may provide the evidence needed to support any relevant further action.

Before we can consider a location for mobile camera enforcement we would need some current evidence of speed from a speed survey or local educational activity such as Speedwatch.

Cublington Parish Council observation – we have been operating SpeedWatch for several years. Speedwatch only records vehicles which exceed 36mph due to legal reasons and drivers are written to by the Police warning them of their speeding. We shall now record the number of vehicles exceeding 30mph and inform Thames Valley Police and explore the possibility of fixed camera enforcement.





# Thames Water response to information supplied to them by the Parish Council Sewer flooding Dear Mike

I'm writing further to your email dated 22 August. Initially I wanted to apologise for the delay in responding to you. I've reviewed your enquiry regarding the ongoing sewer issues in Cublington, and I'm happy to confirm I've contacted the relevant internal teams to discuss the possibility of implementing a planned maintenance programme.

This recommendation follows the visit from our engineer on 19 August, who confirmed while the sewer is currently free flowing, there was evidence of debris buildup. This suggests a regular maintenance schedule could help prevent future blockages, particularly during the winter months when issues have historically occurred.

Once I receive confirmation from our teams regarding the feasibility and frequency of such a programme, I'll be in touch again to update you.

Thank you again for your patience and for the positive feedback about our Complaints department.

### Bucks Council response to MP Laura Kyrke-Smith's office

### Dear Laura

Thank you for your enquiry on behalf of your constituents regarding road safety and HGV traffic in Cublington.

Advisory signage indicating "Unsuitable for HGVs" is currently in place at the junction of Wingrave Road and the A418. This signage is intended to alert HGV drivers to the challenges of the route that passes through Aston Abbots and continues to Cublington. An additional advisory sign is located at the junction of Moat Lane and The Green within Aston Abbots village. At present, there is no evidence to suggest that this signage is causing HGV traffic to divert through Cublington; however, we welcome any documented local feedback on this matter.

### Regarding the specific questions raised:

### Is Aston Abbots currently included in a freight strategy?

Aston Abbots is not identified as a priority location in the adopted freight strategy; it is not therefore currently included in any strategic freight planning or intervention.

### What freight strategy is in place for this area?

The nearest strategic freight initiative is the pilot Ivinghoe Freight Zone, located south of the A418. This zone provides designated alternative routes for HGVs via the A418, A4146, A505, and A41, allowing them to bypass the restricted area. The effectiveness of this pilot is currently being evaluated, including the potential need for strong enforcement measures.

### Could similar measures be considered for Cublington?

Before considering a similar approach for Cublington, we must first assess the outcomes of the Ivinghoe pilot, including its effectiveness and the associated costs of implementing legal restrictions and signage. It is important to note that Cublington is not currently designated as a priority area for freight strategy intervention. Consequently, there is no allocated funding or resources for such measures in

the village. That said, there may be potential for more localised action. This could be explored through the Buckinghamshire Highways Commissioning team. To initiate this, it would be helpful to compile detailed evidence of the issues faced and request a feasibility study. This study could identify possible solutions, provide recommendations, and offer cost estimates. Funding for such an initiative is likely to need to come from the Parish Council.

With regard to road safety, this is a key priority for Buckinghamshire Highways and our current policy focuses on reducing the frequency and severity of injury-related collisions across the highway network. While we receive numerous requests for safety improvements, we are unable to address every location.

Each year, we review all reported injury collisions in the county, and conduct analysis of the contributory factors recorded for each cluster site, as provided by Thames Valley Police, to identify high-risk sites. This analysis informs the development of targeted safety schemes. The roads in Cublington Parish have a strong safety record and do not feature in our annual review of collision sites. As such, they do not qualify for funding for further assessments or additional measures at this time.

Should the Parish wish to pursue a commissioned investigation and design options, this would need to be funded independently. Requests can be directed to our Highways Commissioning Team at bhcommissioning@buckinghamshire.gov.uk.

Speed limit enforcement falls under the responsibility of Thames Valley Police. Concerns about speeding should be reported to the Local Neighbourhood Team, who will assess the need for enforcement based on injury collision data. While resources are limited, enforcement may also be considered at 'Community Concern' sites where local reports indicate a problem.

Concerns can be submitted via SpeedSolutions@thamesvalley.pnn.police.uk, and this allows TVP to build up intelligence on speeding concerns.

We also encourage continued participation in the Community Speed Watch initiative. The data collected supports Thames Valley Police in determining appropriate enforcement levels.

Please note that decisions regarding restrictions on through-traffic are strategic in nature and not based solely on road safety considerations.
