#### 20th May was International Bee Day

(or National, not too sure) so it was apt that Alan found a swarm of honey bees in his laurel bushes. Michael checked on the location, and suitably clad and with a box and sheet, collected the swarm and hived it into an empty hive.



Swarming is a natural process, and is the honey bees' way of increasing the number of colonies. The original queen, after a number of 'queen cells' have been built in the hive, departs with a large number of the workers and sets up a new home somewhere else. This may be in a hollow tree or hole in a wall, or, if located in time, in a fresh hive! The original hive rears a new queen and continues in the first hive.

The swarming bees sound dramatic as they move off, but are full of honey. They are moving home and take as much honey as they can, so that they have food while building thier new colony. They are not generally aggressive, which makes collecting the swarm a lot easier.

The day seems to go largely unmarked in England – unless you're prepared for a dawn raid on Stonehenge. I love the idea of gathering around a big fire and remembering the eternal links that we have to the sun, the seasons, growing and harvesting. I'm not too fussed about the herring though...

Let's hope June heralds sunny days, warm evenings and overnight rain so there is something to celebrate on June 21st.



#### North Field update

Volunteers have been busy on North Field with general maintenance tasks including cutting the grass around the orchard, trimming the wandering footpaths and checking the tree stakes and ties in the orchard, in the blossom circle and the 'feature' trees. The plan this year is to keep the orchard and blossom circle areas trimmed with the grasses in a substantial central area of the field left to grow. Residents who were up and about early at the weekend might have seen Dennis using his scythe to trim grasses around the orchard, a much quicker and neater way than using strimmers or a hand scythe.



The up and coming working group dates for North Field as:

9.30am - 12.00 midday: Saturday 24th June; Saturday 22nd July; Saturday 22nd August.

It would be great to have some more volunteers to help out even for an hour.

Why are Scot's Pine trees significant to Cublington? In 1897, Queen Victoria's daughter planted a Scot's Pine tree at Waddesdon Manor to mark her mother's Diamond Jubillee and gave a number of Scot's Pine trees which were planted at other Rothschild properties including here in Cublington; these now mature trees can been seen off Reads Lane.

Please keep a watch out for Ragwort growing on North Field and use one of the 'ragwort canes' to mark where it is. We can then dig it out. The Ragwort is the plant with the yellow topped clusters of daisy-like flowers.



North Field will be launching a 'Friends of North Field' group at the village fete on 17th June. Regular small donations are being sought to hep towards the running and maintenance costs of North Field. Whilst we have been successful in getting several grants for the purchase of a good number of trees and the set up costs, and other grants will be sought, we now have costs for the maintenance of the field. Could you give a regular donation to North Field? Money will be held in the Orchard Ground Association accounts as a designated fund for North Field.

**Cublington Cricket Club**

Cricket has been played in Cublington for over 150 years, with the first recorded game played in 1863. The club as it is today was founded in 1955, and in 1997 a new pavilion was built with assistance from the

National Lottery & Sports Council. Our Orchard Ground facility is the home of cricket, tennit and local community events, and was extended in 2005 to include a fabulous score box.

Until the late 1990's friendly fixtures were played on Saturdays or Sundays and it was not uncommon for the Captain to be found scouring the village to try and find a full complement of players around lunchtime on the day of the match.

Since then, Cublington Cricket Club has grown substantially, guided by four Core Values: Youth & Women's cricket development - Community - Sustainability - Enjoyment

#### The club has now graduated from its casual beginnings to being in a position to field;

- Two Saturday League sides;
- A Woman's team evolving as a pathway for our junior girls;
- Sunday friendly side;
- A thriving diverse junior membership (girls and boys). Junior Teams from U9s to U17s providing competitive cricket for up to 100 budding young cricketers.
- We are an All Stars Hub, providing a safe environment each Summer for children aged between 6 and 8 years of age to enjoy cricket

Cublington CC are ECB Clubmark Accredited and all our officials are validated by the ECB Safe Hands Management System.







### From the Rector



Birds of a feather flock together; that English saying about sticking with those who are just like us. The saying came to mind because the Church has just celebrated the festival of Pentecost. Pentecost means fifty; it came fifty days after the first Easter and the risen Christ kept his promise to send his followers the Holy Spirit. Jesus' followers were gathered in Jerusalem as were people from across the then known world. The Holy Spirit came upon Jesus' followers and they began proclaiming the Gospel of Christ to all around them. There were many different languages spoken amongst those in Jerusalem, but each could hear Jesus' followers in their own, native, language. It was the miracle of Pentecost and why it holds a special place in the church year. It is recorded in Acts chapter two.

The message of Pentecost is that the Gospel of Christ is for the whole world which included us here – we should never forget that Christianity did not begin on our shores, but came later. In the sixth century Pope Gregory sent one Augustine to tell us about Jesus only to find that the story was known already via Celtic Christianity, probably from the second century. And here's the thing, Celtic Christianity began without any formal church structures; no clergy, no synods. The Holy Spirit was out and about.

Pentecost also contains a challenge and quite a subversive challenge at that. As we know, no language translates exactly into another and that's because language, words, are shorthand for ideas, emotions, principles. All of which are culturally based. That may therefore mean that the language of "those people over there" may give them a richer appreciation of some aspect of life, including faith, than our language gives us – whoever "us" happens to be. And therein lies the subversive challenge of Pentecost. The Gospel is not to be owned by one particular group and as Acts unfolds, Paul writes "I now know that God shows no partiality".

In the 1970s there was a sit-com called Birds of a Feather which starred Linda Robson and Pauline Quirk. Two sisters, the irony was that they were completely different. In today's social media world with its many opportunities to register our "likes", Pentecost calls us beyond that, whoever we are, to ascribe greatness to the Lord, our God. Or, in phonetic Urdu, khudar harani chattan caro-y-bayan.



All entries must be home produced. All produce must be ripe and shown in a clean condition and polished to improve the look.

It is hoped that produce will be available to be sold after the show for Friends of St Nicholas but if you wish to keep your produce please remove it after judging.

#### **Judges Tips**

Freshness is important.

Quality and uniformity.

All vegetables must be cleaned well.

Onions must have roots taken off.

Beans must have about 2mm stalks on.

Apples must have stalks on.

It is preferable for beets to have a straight root, so snip off any curly ones.

Flowers on courgettes is good.

Label your five named herbs in a terracotta pot.

#### **Carrot and Parsnip Cake**

4 eggs 200g brown sugar 100g caster sugar 250ml vegetable oil 1 tsp vanilla extract 2 tsp cinnamon 1 tsp dried ginger 1 tsp nutmeg ½ tsp cardamom 350g plain flour 2 tsp baking powder Pinch of salt 250g carrot, grated 125g parsnip, grated 100g pecans + a few to garnish

Cream Cheese Icing

200g pure icing sugar 100g unsalted butter 250g cream cheese Zest/juice of one lemon 1 tsp vanilla extract Preheat oven to 180 degrees Celsius and grease and line a 24cm cake tin. Peel and grate carrots and parsnip, set aside.

Using electric beaters or a stand mixer, beat together eggs and sugars until light and pale – this will take about 5-7 minutes. Stream in olive oil, beating to combine. Add vanilla and all spices and beat to combine. Sift in flour, baking powder and salt and then fold together until just combined, do no overwork. Fold in carrots, parsnip and nuts and pour into the prepared cake tin.

Bake for about an hour and ten minutes, turning it halfway. It may take a bit longer to cook depending on your oven but keep an eye on it. As soon as a skewer comes out clean, you're good to go. Let the cake cool completely before assembling.

#### **Cream Cheese Icing**

With electric beaters, beat your room temperature butter until soft and smooth. Add in your room temperature cream cheese and beat until smooth; there should be no more clumps of butter or cream cheese, super smooth.

Sift icing sugar into a separate bowl, and add to the mixer one tablespoon at a time, beating well between each addition. After you first add a spoon of sugar, beat on the lowest speed until just combined, then turn up to medium/high for a couple of minutes before adding the next scoop of sugar. Continue beating until all sugar is incorporated and it feels completely smooth when rubbed between two fingers. Add lemon zest, juice and vanilla and beat to combine.

Spread liberally on top and scatter with leftover nuts.

During the year it was upsetting to see the roof taken off Ridings Cottage.

In the past years the PC has improved the playground and access to it, along with traffic calming projects and has always worked to create a community spirit and a safe and secure environment for the village and The meeting thanked Hugh Vale for all his hard work and the hours he commits to the village . His extensive knowledge of the village and guidance on matters is appreciated by everyone .

#### 4. Accounts for Year ended 31.3.23.

The end of year accounts was discussed. There was a surplus of £3,083.80 and the closing cash balance on 31st March 2023 was £21,702.75.

Mr Ian Ashcroft of Lucy Developments and Mr Paul Southouse of Paul Southouse Architects attended the start of the meeting to discuss the proposed development of land adjacent to Walnuts 4 Aston Abbotts Road, Cublington. A revised planning application, 23/01189/APP has been submitted which replaces the approved application 21/01248/APP. Mr Ashcroft gave a background to Lucy Developments and Mr Southouse presented the changes to the approved

permission. In summary the original application was for three detached and two semi-detached houses whilst the new application is for five detached houses. Design plans were distributed setting out the new plans with comparison to the old plans. The company has met neighbours to the site to explain the changes and a construction management plan. A discussion took place over the plans and approach to the project.

The company hopes to start the development this summer and anticipated it taking 14 months to completion. Cllr Vale pointed out that hemlock was growing on the site which needs to be sprayed as it spreads very quickly.

The owners are not allowed to do any work on the site until a planning application has been granted otherwise an enforcement notice will be issued. The Forestry Commission is continuing its investigation of the site.

The clerk asked the county councillors for assistance on the following matters:

- 1. The gate and fence at Orchard Ground had been damaged by a contractor (Hanson) of Transport for Bucks when the Stewkley Road was resurfaced in February this year. A claim had been made through the proper channels, but nothing is happening.
- 2. It was felt the quality of resurfacing on the Stewkley Road was poor.
- 3. A pothole was repaired last week just outside Orchard Ground entrance. It was the size of a laptop computer whilst there were numerous potholes at the entrance to Silver Street ignored. We had received numerous complaints from residents on the quality of the work.
- 4. Repair work should have been completed on Church Path. This was first raised in July 2022.
- 5. There is an issue with kerb posts concerning encroachment of council land outside New Dairy Farm which was raised in May 2022.
- 6. Roadworks near Acorn Farm took over a week. Why did this work take so long?

Cllr Blamires requested backup information for each query and the clerk said he would send an email to her.

- Midsummer and the summer solstice can be a few days apart. This year, summer solstice occurs at 3.58pm on Wednesday 21st June.
- According to pagan folklore, evil spirits would appear on the summer solstice. To ward off evil spirits, people would wear protective garlands of herbs and flowers.
- The summer solstice was typically marked by Celtic, Slavic and Germanic people by lighting bonfires, intended to boost the sun's strength for the remainder of the crop season and ensure a healthy harvest.
- Lighting and jumping over bonfires on Midsummer's Eve dates to pre-Christian pagan customs. It was thought to keep demons away and bring good luck to lovers.



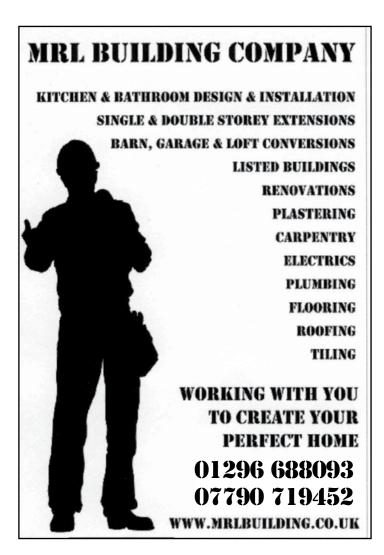
