

It feels like only yesterday we had to make an extremely embarrassing phone call to a locksmith explaining how, after only owning the house for 2 hours, we'd locked ourselves out! Luckily, we must have honest faces as he didn't seem too phased.

Given it being our anniversary month, it seems very apt to have the privilege of being guest editor for the Crier.

LATEST NEWS and UPDATES



Orchard Ground

As reported in the Parish Council minutes, A grant application has been made to FCC Community Action Fund (formally Wren) for solar panels in the name of CPC on behalf of Orchard Ground for \$23,500. This was declined. Sundry plumbing work has been carried out, and legionella maintenance work is being completed. Repairs to loose bricks outside the pavilion have been completed, roof tiles replaced by the cricket club and weedkiller is being regularly applied to the carpark.

The Tree Council has offered OG to make another application for \$2,000 of trees.

Draft Lease New Charity

The final draft lease has been received. An application can now be made to the Charities Commission for registration of the new charity.

North Field

Volunteers continue to meet and work on the North field area, planting more trees, replacing dead saplings that haven't survived the difficult conditions this year. It is quite amazing what these Cublington volunteers have achieved in just 2 years. Another 50 volunteers have also helped with community planting events, with the 7 Red Oak trees and 9 Scotts Pine trees which were planted to commemorate the life and reign of the late Queen Elizabeth II.

Volunteering for the North Field is very flexible, recognising that people have other commitments.

Whilst most of work happens on Saturday mornings, other volunteering happens at other times too. The work parties on Saturdays run from 9.30am to 12.00 midday and finish with tea/coffee and bacon rolls courtesy of Jenny Brown.

Please feel free to drop in on any of the dates below to have a chat to any of the volunteers, or joining in on one of the planting days. This volunteering has a social dynamic and is a great way of meeting new people and catching up with friends.

The past few weeks has see the work teams on North Field replacing dead whips and clearing grass from around the saplings. Huge thanks to Hugh Vale for topping the majority of the North Field enabling us to keep it under control. Thank you to all those who have 'flagged' the ragwort and reported the whereabouts of this invasive plant.

November 2023 Events & Celebrations

Here are some key dates and events happening this November in the UK and around the world.

1st - World Vegan Day

The joys and benefits of veganism are advocated on this dedicated day, highlighting just how easy it is to go for this plant-based lifestyle.

3rd - World Jellyfish Day

A day to appreciate and celebrate jellyfish, which are not, in fact, a fish at all. Due to climate change, overall jellyfish numbers are increasing, however some species are on the endangered list.

5th - Guy Fawkes Night

When the British celebrate the Gunpowder Plot conspirators failure to blow up the Houses of Parliament in 1605. Also known as Bonfire Night or Fireworks Night. It is celebrated with fireworks and the burning of an effigy on a bonfire, known as a Guy.





11th - Remembrance Day

The day when we remember those members of the armed forces who gave their lives in conflict. The date was chosen to commemorate the end of hostilities of the First World War on 11th November 1918.

12th - Diwali

Diwali is the Hindu festival of Lights, which is celebrated with fireworks, dancing, music, the decoration of homes and feasting. The most important aspect is decorating with lights, especially the traditional Diwa candles.



Odd Socks Day marks the beginning of Anti-Bullying Week. All you have to do is wear odd socks to school or work.





15th - Steve Irwin Day

Celebrated each year on 15th November, Steve Irwin Day is an annual international event honouring the life and legacy of the one and only Crocodile Hunter, and to highlight his passion for animal conservation.

21st - World Hello Day

Anyone can participate in World Hello Day simply by greeting ten people. This demonstrates the importance of personal

communication for preserving peace.

23rd - Doctor Who Day

Also known as TARDIS day, this is the anniversary of the first ever transmission of Doctor Who.

23rd to 24th - Thanksgiving

US national holiday which is a celebration of the successful harvest and other blessings of the past year.

24th - Buy Nothing Day

Held to coincide with Black Friday, this is an international day of protest against consumerism, where people are encouraged to buy nothing at all that day.





26th Nov to 3rd Dec - National Tree Week

The UK's largest annual tree celebration, where the UK's conservation sector, volunteer groups and tree-lovers come together to plant thousands of trees to mark the start of the tree planting season.


Calling all crime fiction readers



From the Rector



Remembering

As we move into November, our thoughts turn to Remembrance or Armistice Day. For those who take part, it is a poignant occasion when our world briefly stops and we remember; and we recite the names on our war memorials. And therein lies a challenge. We could be related to one or more individual whose name we recite and we may have been told about them from within our family, but in many cases, they are unknown to us (I used to know a woman whose three great uncles, brothers, are listed, but she never knew them). As time progresses, even family memories will fade and the challenge is thus how to remember? What is it we are remembering?

I suggest our starting point is to remember their humanity and this is where local history projects come to the fore. Discovering and recording the lives of the fallen local to our community suddenly emphasises that they were real people; Stewkley school has an excellent such project on display in the school foyer. Also, the Commonwealth War Graves Commission records their stories and maintains their graves, including the graves of those who died after the war from injuries sustained during it. Most of the churchyards in our group have graves monitored by the Commission.



But it isn't just the stories prior to joining up, it's also what they did once there. I think one of the most arresting is the Christmas Eve football match in 1914. The story of that camaraderie is well known, but how surprised was I to learn of a second truce! Easter 1915 on the eastern front on the shores of the Vistula River. For four days, Easter eggs were exchanged and placards in German and Russian proclaimed Christ is Risen! Significant I think, these happening at major Christian festivals.

The war to end all wars turned out a vain cry, but as we grapple with a world steeped in turmoil remembering the humanity of the fallen is how we meet the challenge of them not being known. And, perhaps, we might give some thought to how something bigger than war seems to have walked the battlefield on at least two occasions.

Beating the Winter Blues

I'm lucky enough to be sat in my garden on an uncharacteristically warm October evening as I write this. There's not much I enjoy more than sitting outside when the weather is nice and feeling the warmth of the sun on my face. It's something I'm going to miss terribly as we head into winter.

Seasonal affective disorder (SAD) is a type of depression that comes and goes in a seasonal pattern. It's sometimes known as "winter depression" because the symptoms are usually more apparent and severe during the winter, although some people can experience it in the summer.

Research has shown that one in three people in the UK suffer from SAD, and women are 40% more likely than men to experience symptoms of the condition. The exact cause of SAD is not fully understood, but it's often linked to reduced exposure to sunlight during the shorter autumn and winter days.

There are a number of things you can try to help improve your symptoms:

- Try to get as much natural sunlight as possible even a brief lunchtime walk can be beneficial.
- Make your work and home environments as light and airy as possible.
- Sit near windows when you're indoors.
- Take plenty of regular exercise, particularly outdoors and in daylight.
- Eat a healthy, balanced diet.
- Make time to do things you enjoy or try a new hobby.
- Do things that make you happy why not put your Christmas decorations up early if that makes you smile.
- Learn ways to relax, such as mindfulness or spending more time in nature.
- Plan things to look forward to, such as a meal out with friends.
- If possible, avoid stressful situations and take steps to manage stress.
- Don't suffer in silence reach out to friends and family so they understand how you're feeling and can support you.
- Try using a SAD light box or a dawn simulator alarm clock which lights up gradually to fill your bedroom with a glow.
- Celebrate winter for all the things you love about it, rather than getting bogged down in the negatives.

If you are struggling to cope, consider speaking to your GP who may offer one or a combination of the following treatments:

- Light therapy where a special lamp called a light box is used to simulate exposure to sunlight.
- Talking therapies such as cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT) or counselling.
- Antidepressant medicine.

Ash Dieback: The Silent Pandemic


Tring Woods is a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and is one of the standout treasures of the Chiltern Hills. The vibrant autumn display by the turning beech, ash, birch and cherry offer a feast of colour. Red kites and buzzards flicking in and out of view as they pass overhead, whilst the decaying leaf matter provides a wide ranging banquet of delights supporting fungi at this time of year.

This ever changing seasonal dance, unique but always familiar, is under threat. A disease of our most beloved ash trees is becoming a blight to our landscape and holds no prisoners. A simple stroll through a local woodland will deliver, to the discerning eye, glimpses of infected and stressed mature trees. However, visit a woodland at the front lines of the conflict and picture is more forthright; row after row of dead trees.

Ash is one of Britain's 32 native species of trees. As our third most common tree, they are a vital part of the ecosystems in our woodlands and hedgerows, as well as a durable wood found in our homes. Ash dieback disease, caused by the fungus *Hymenoscyphus fraxineus*, was first identified in the UK in 2012. With over a 90% mortality rate, a recent study by the University of Oxford indicated the cost will exceed 15bn to remove all infected trees. The current picture suggests mature trees are more robust to the infection, but younger trees have less resources, and subsequently have little resistance. The stark reality of the disease is clear to see in the photo below of the same tree before and after becoming infected.







This is what has unfortunately happened in Tring Woods. Ash dieback has struck, and the well-trodden paths snaking their way up the escarpment are littered with semi-mature dead ash trees. The bronze hue of the smooth bark is a pertinent sign of the infection, along with a diamond shaped lesion and the obvious 'dieback' of the branch tips on the more resilient, mature trees.

In our current climate of a blame and claim culture, actions must be taken. The nearby nature reserve of Pavis Wood, run by Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire Wildlife Trust (BBOWT), has already conducted large scale felling of infected trees within falling distance of footpaths and boundaries to the tune of £400k, with this figure only set to increase. This ground zero approach deeply scars the woodland, leaving a broken ecology similar to the frowned upon logging practices in distant countries. But what choice do they have. The trees are dead...



If you're unfamiliar with this conflict, I would ask you make a visit to a nearby woodland and see for yourself the devastation unfolding before our very eyes, as ash trees are now unfortunately becoming an endangered species.





2. Minutes of last meeting

The minutes of the last meeting held on 3rd July 2023 were discussed by the meeting and duly signed by the Chair.

3. Declaration of Interest

None.

4. Reports

Bucks Council Councillors

The community board representative is carrying out road trips around the villages. There was no obvious day or time which would be convenient for Cublington so it was suggested the representative should be present at our village fete. The meeting went through the points requiring assistance from our county councillors.

1. CPC had carried out the repairs to the gate post and fenced damaged by a contractor of Bucks Council. It raised an invoice for the works to Bucks Council stating non settlement would result in taking the Council to the small claims court. This communication was copied to the litigation department and Cllr Steve Broadbent who is the Cabinet Member Bucks Council responsible for Transport. No response has been received and the meeting agreed to proceed with legal action against Bucks Council.

Cllr Diana Blamires said she would try once again to get Cllr Broadbent to review the case.

2. A summary of points discussed at Local Area Technician site visit was discussed. A schedule of outstanding points was produced which will be

updated regularly to monitor action points. Reads Lane and Ridings Way are roads that are priority roads for resurfacing and Cllr Blamires will raise this request with Highways Dept.

3. The County Councillors felt there was little more they could do concerning Red Brick recycling unit.

Cllr Blamires reported on a presentation she had made to Bucks Council on the importance of appropriate provision for children and young people with ADHD.

Wingrave has had a request for 20mph speed zone turned down.

5.2 To review the accounting statements to 31st August 2023

6. Orchard Ground/ North Field Report

A grant application has been made to FCC Community Action Fund (formally Wren) for solar panels in the name of CPC on behalf of Orchard Ground for £23,500. A decision from FCC will be made by the end of August. Sundry plumbing work has been carried out, and legionella maintenance work needs to be completed.

The Tree Council has offered OG to make another application for £2,000 of trees.

6.1 Draft Lease Considerations/New Charity

The final draft lease has been received. An application can now be made to the Charities Commission for registration of the new charity. Parrott and Coales is ceasing to trade at the end of September, and they apologised for their poor service on this matter. Our files will be transferred to Kidd Rapinet.

7. Planning Permissions

7.1 19/04435/ACL Wing Caravan Site – application for certificate of lawfulness for existing caravan site. The Inspectorate held an informal hearing last week – appeal has been refused.

Cllr Shults and his team were thanked for their excellent work. There is a need for more volunteers.

Lockharts – Bulk Transfer Limited is parking lorries on the site which is not registered as an operating centre. Clerk to report to Vehicle Operator Licensing.

Red Brick Farm – it was felt the number of lorry movements are exceeding the number allowed under the conditions of planning application. Clerk to contact Enforcement Dept .

8.2 Street Lighting

The LED replacement quotation was deficient in detail, so the contractor has been asked to come out and survey the existing lights to enable a comprehensive quotation.

8.3 Trees and hedges

It was noted there were still hedges and trees that needed cutting throughout the village. The Local Area Technician had been asked to establish which landowners were responsible for trees and hedges throughout the village. It is important all paths are accessible, and streetlights are clear of tree/hedge branches.

8.4 Playground Maintenance

Wickstead had completed maintenance work on the cableway. Further work is required and a quote for £1,248 has been received from Wickstead. Clerk to obtain quotations from other companies/individuals. A replacement porthole has been delivered and fitted. There were other minor deficiencies highlighted which will be looked at.

8.5 Waste Bins

Bucks Council has changed its contractors concerning dog waste bins. The broken bin at OG will be replaced once a new contractor is in place. The general waste bins locking system have deteriorated over the years and Bucks Council has requested the bins are replaced with ones that have metal locks. The clerk felt the bins in other villages were no better than ours, so he suggested we leave the matter.

8.6 Best Kept Village and Community Award

Cublington has won a community award and runner up in the best kept villageaward. There will be a formal presentation of the awards at the next meeting on 14thNovember. The chair suggest Cllr Reillyaccepts the Best Kept Village Award andCllr Waters accepts the community award on behalf of the parish council to reflect their hard work in these areas. It was suggested we provide light refreshments for the presentation and open the meeting to residents.




